


## Old King Glory



Old King Glo-ry on the moun - tain, the moun-tain was so  
high that it near-ly touchedthe sky, and it's one, two, three fol-low me.

Dancers hold hands in a circle. Leader on the outside. Dancers start singing and circling to the left (Clockwise) while the Leader walks around the outside of the circle in the opposite direction (Counterclockwise). One 'one, two, three' the Leader touches three adjacent dancers on their shoulders. The third dancer to be touched leaves the circle and takes the Leader's left hand with the dancer's right hand. The 'one, two' dancers that were touched stay in the circle. Keep repeating this, each time the same Leader does the touching and choosing, and each new 'third' dancer leaves the circle and joins the end of the growing line trailing behind the Leader and circling around the shrinking inner circle. Continue until there is only one dancer left in the middle. Then all sing:

'Old King Glory on the mountain,  
The mountain was so high that it nearly touched the sky  
(All stop walking)  
And we all bow to the mountain'

All bow to the one left in the middle. If you repeat the game the last middle person can become the new leader.
